General

This tariff references the National Exchange Carrier Association, Inc., Access Service Tariff F.C.C. No.5 for its terms and conditions. This tariff contains rates applicable to Interstate Access Services provided within the State of Kansas by Wheat State Telephone Company with the exception of End User Access, ISDN Line Ports, DS1 Line Port and Federal Universal Service Fund charges. End User Access Rates are set forth in National Exchange Carrier Association, Inc., Tariff F.C.C. No. 5, at 17.1.2. Federal Universal Service Fund charges are set forth in National Exchange Carrier Association, Inc., Tariff F.C.C. No. 5, at 17.1.3. ISDN Line Port charges are set forth in National Exchange Carrier Association, Inc., Tariff F.C.C. No. 5, at 17.1.4. DS1 Line Port charge is set forth in NECA, Inc. Tariff F.C.C. No. 5 at 17.1.5.

This tariff is filed in accordance with the F.C.C Part 61 rules in 47 C.F.R. Section 61.39.

## ACCESS SERVICE

### 1. APPLICATION OF TARIFF

- 1.1 This tariff contains rates and charges applicable to the provision of Switched Access and Special Access Services, and other miscellaneous services, hereinafter referred to collectively as service(s), provided by Wheat State Telephone Company, hereinafter referred to as the Telephone Company, to customers. This tariff also contains Access Ordering charges that are applicable when these services are ordered or modified by the customer. The Telephone Company participates in the NECA Tariff F.C.C. No. 5 for Carrier Common Line Services, End User Access, Federal Universal Service Fund Services, and ISDN Line Port Services, and DS1 Line Port therefore the rates and charges for these services are as provided in the NECA F.C.C. Tariff No. 5.
- 1.2 The provision of such service by the Telephone Company as set forth in this tariff does not constitute a joint undertaking with the Customer for the furnishing of any service.
- 1.3 Wheat State Telephone Company in accordance with the provisions of Part 61.39(a) of the FCC's Rules and Regulations did elect to file its own tariff and reference the regulations, terms and conditions of the National Exchange Carrier Association, Inc. (NECA) Tariff F.C.C. No. 5, Access Service, for the General Regulations, End User Common Line, Carrier Common Line, Switched Services, Special Access, and Universal Service Fund Services, and other miscellaneous services contained therein. Regulations, terms, and conditions applicable to these services are therefore specifically cross referenced and included in the following sections of the National Exchange Carrier Association, Inc. ## ACCESS SERVICE

### 8. DIGITAL SUBSCRIBER LINE ACCESS SERVICES

Digital Subscriber Line Services provide transmission services over local exchange service facilities that can be used for simultaneous voice and data communications. Service is provided, where available, between customers designated premises and designated Telephone Company Serving Wire Centers.

#### 8.1 Asymmetric Digital Subscriber Line Services

##### 8.1.1 General

Asymmetric Digital Subscriber Line (ADSL) Service enables data generated by the customer's equipment to be transported to a DSL Service Connection Point using local exchange service facilities. A DSL Service Connection Point is an interconnection point designated by the Telephone Company that aggregates data traffic from and to Telephone Company ADSL Serving Wire Centers (SWC's). The customer for ADSL Service is the subscriber of the Telephone Company's local exchange service.

##### 8.1.2 Limitations

ADSL Service is available at selected upstream speeds from 64 kbps to 512 kbps (i.e., from the customer's equipment up to the DSL Service Connection Point) and a maximum downstream speed of 1.544 Mbps (from the DSL Service Connection Point down to the customer's equipment). These peak speeds are not guaranteed by the Telephone Company due to factors that may affect the actual speeds delivered, including loop distance from the Telephone Company Serving Wire Center, condition of the facilities, and limitations in the telecommunications service provider's network design. The Telephone Company does not provide customer premises equipment (CPE) in conjunction with the ADSL Service offering.

The data rates (speeds) apply to the local loop segment of the facility provided by the Telephone Company. The Telephone Company cannot guarantee effective throughput beyond its copper facility (the ADSL circuit), for example, at an Internet Service Provider's server or at a Local Area Network (LAN) server.

##### 8.1.3 Obligations of the Customer

In addition to the regulations described in other sections of this tariff, the following provisions apply to ADSL Service:

- (A) The Customer must subscribe to local exchange service from the Telephone Company pursuant to the Telephone Company's general and/or local exchange service tariffs. The Telephone Company will automatically disconnect ADSL Service when the associated local exchange service is disconnected for any reason.

### 8. Digital Subscriber Line Services

#### 8.1.3 Obligations of the Customer (Cont'd)

- (B) The customer is responsible for providing the Telephone Company with the necessary information to provision ADSL Service (e.g., customer name, telephone number and premises address; billing name and address when different from the customer name and premises address; customer contact name and telephone number and the contact name and telephone number of the telecommunications service provider with which the customer's ADSL Service will interconnect).
- (C) The customer is responsible for providing and maintaining all required customer provided equipment (CPE), which is compatible with ADSL Service.

#### 8.1.4 Rate Regulations

This section contains the regulations governing the rates and charges that apply for ADSL Service. The rates for ADSL Service will be billed to the subscriber of the local exchange service.

##### (A) Minimum Period

The minimum period for which ADSL Service is provided to a customer and for which charges are applicable is one month.

##### (B) Moves

A move involves a change in the physical location of one of the following:

The Point of Termination at the customer designated premises  
The customer designated premises

##### (C) Temporary Suspension of Service

When an ADSL Service customer temporarily suspends its local exchange service, the ADSL Service and one-half of the ADSL Line Charge monthly rate will be temporarily suspended for the time period that the associated local exchange service is suspended.

#### 8.1.4 Rate Regulations (Cont'd)

##### (D) Rate Categories

There are two types of rates and charges applicable to ADSL Service. These are a monthly rate and a nonrecurring charge.

The monthly rate applies each month or fraction thereof for each local exchange service line equipped with ADSL Service.

A nonrecurring charge applies per local exchange service line for the installation of ADSL Service.

Rates and charges for ADSL Service are as set forth in Section 17.4.9 following.

### 8.2 Promotions

Special pricing promotions may be offered to customers ordering ADSL Services. Such promotions will be of short duration and may include discounts of the monthly rates and/or installation charges.
