In the *Wireline Broadband Order*, 20 FCC Rcd 14853 (2005), the Commission concluded that Verizon was no longer required to offer Digital Subscriber Line ("DSL") service as a telecommunications service under Title II of the Communications Act. On July 31, 2006, the Verizon Telephone Companies ("Verizon") filed Transmittal 722, which removed its New Jersey DSL services from Tariff FCC No. 1. Effective today, these services are being removed from price caps.

Demand, rates, and revenues for the New Jersey DSL rate elements were identified and removed before the indices were re-calculated. The price cap indices are not changed as a result of this filing. See Workpaper New Jersey DSL Removal Detail and Workpaper Indices Comparison. Support material as specified in Section 61.49 of the Commission's Rules is attached.
