With this filing, Verizon is amending Transmittal Letter No. 779, filed February 22, 2007, to explain the reduction in the nonrecurring charge filed from that filed in Transmittal 713.

Transmittal No. 779 was filed to correct a nonrecurring charge filed in Transmittal No. 713, effective June 14, 2006. The rate filed in Transmittal No. 713 was inaccurate. It was based on an estimate of fiber, materials, and labor to install facilities for a Verizon customer. Following a site visit, Verizon determined that significantly fewer feet of new fiber would have to be installed to provide the facilities than Verizon had estimated when Verizon filed Transmittal No. 713. This change also reduced the number of labor hours required to complete the project and eliminated a fee Verizon typically charged when hiring an outside contractor. All of this reduced the cost for providing the requested facilities, and the non-recurring charge was reduced accordingly, as reflected in Transmittal No. 779.

Verizon is filing this amended transmittal letter electronically today via the Federal Communications Commission's Electronic Tariff Filing System (ETFS).
