

**NEVADA BELL TELEPHONE COMPANY
DESCRIPTION AND JUSTIFICATION
TRANSMITTAL NO. 164
August 27, 2007**

PURPOSE

With this filing, Nevada Bell Telephone Company (NBTC) proposes to introduce Forwarded Call Information (FCI) and Network Forwarded Call Information (NFCI) as new Switched Access service Basic Service Elements (BSEs)/Common Switching Optional Features (CSOFs).

SERVICE DESCRIPTION

Forwarded Call Information (FCI) BSE

The Forwarded Call Information (FCI) BSE/CSOF is available with Access Line Arrangement (ALA)/Feature Group A (FGA), using the Hunt Group Arrangement BSE/CSOF and Special Access Voice Grade Service (Technical Specification Package VG-10), where technically feasible, in suitably equipped end offices. Voice Grade Special Access Service is provided in NBTC Tariff F.C.C. No. 1, Section 7 (Special Access Service). The FCI BSE/CSOF may not be used in conjunction with the NFCI BSE/CSOF in the same ALA/FGA Hunt Group Arrangement.

FCI provides the ability to transmit and receive call information using a line side ALA/FGA in a Hunt Group Arrangement. Call detail information is transmitted to the customer's premises using Voice Grade Special Access Service (Technical Specification Package VG-10). FCI requires a 1200 or 2400 baud data termination on a four-wire Voice Grade Access Service (Technical Specification Package VG-10) in every office in which a customer has access capability. The Voice Grade Special Access Service must be associated with the ALA/FGA line(s) for use with the BSE/CSOF. Rates and charges

for the Voice Grade Special Access Service (Technical Specification Package VG-10) are specified in Section 7, and are in addition to the rates and charges for the associated line side ALA/FGA and the BSE/CSOF. Message waiting indication capabilities are limited to customers who are served from the same office (intraoffice) as FCI.

Network Forwarded Call Information (NFCI) BSE

The Network Forwarded Call Information (NFCI) BSE/CSOF is available with ALA/FGA using the Hunt Group Arrangement BSE/CSOF and Voice Grade Special Access Service (Technical Specification Package VG-10), where technically feasible, in suitably equipped end offices. Voice Grade Special Access Service is provided in NBTC Tariff F.C.C. No. 1, Section 7 (Special Access Service). The FCI BSE/CSOF may not be used in conjunction with the NFCI BSE/CSOF in the same ALA/FGA Hunt Group Arrangement.

NFCI provides the ability to serve multiple offices with a single Voice Grade Special Access Service using the SS7 signaling network to pass data and signaling information. NFCI enables the customer to transmit and receive call information using a line side ALA/FGA in a Hunt Group Arrangement. NFCI information is transmitted to the customer's premises using Voice Grade Special Access Service (Technical Specification Package VG-10). NFCI requires a 9600 baud data termination on a four-wire Voice Grade Access Service (Technical Specification Package VG-10). The Voice Grade Special Access Service must be associated with the ALA/FGA line(s) arranged for use with the BSE/CSOF. Rates and charges for the Voice Grade Special Access Service (Technical Specification Package VG-10) are specified in Section 7, and are in addition to the rates and charges for the associated line side ALA/FGA and the BSE/CSOF.

NFCI provides originating call detail information and the capability to activate and deactivate message waiting indication on the customer's line. NFCI is used to transmit the called number, the calling number, and a call forwarding indicator (e.g., call forwarding busy line, call forwarding don't answer and direct call). Where customer equipment exists, NFCI allows a customer to activate a Message Waiting Indicator (MWI) in the form of an intermittent dial tone (stutter dial tone) on their end user's line.

The NFCI BSE/CSOF includes the Alternate Network Delivery (AND) feature, which provides the capability for the customer to direct its MWI messages toward the customer's Alternate Network Service Provider within the LATA. Customers who upgrade their FCI service to NFCI or install a new NFCI service may elect to implement the AND feature at the time of the initial order request, or at a later date, at no additional recurring or nonrecurring charge.

PRICE CAP COMPLIANCE

No supporting documentation is required for a new service filing as discussed in Section 61.49 of the Commission's Rules.
